Did you know?

Cartrefi Cymru has 1,200 employees and is one of the 150 largest co-ops in the UK. The largest is the supermarket chain known as "The Co-op". It has 70,000 employees. As we are both co-ops, and both want to help our local communities, we are looking at ways of working together. This Month's Co-op Question

People who are not supported by Cartrefi or employed by Cartrefi can become co-op members as Community Supporters. At the moment, anyone wanting to become a Community Supporter member has their application sent to the nearest Regional Director for approval. The idea is to have some way of checking that people we don't know very well are basically good people that everyone can trust.

The question is:

"Do we want the Regional Directors to carry on with this responsibility? If not, what other ideas have we got for this? Could Forums have a say in approving Community Supporter applications? Or would that sometimes be very embarrassing?"

Please could Forum Chairs put this question on the agenda for discussion at their Forum meeting, and then send the Forum's views to our Co-op Administrator?
