DID YOU KNOW?

There are 465 Credit Unions in the UK. Credit Unions are financial cooperatives that are community-focused and controlled by their members, offering savings and loans.

The range of products they offer depends on local demands. Their directors are volunteers elected from and by the members, and the income they generate is used to meet operating expenses, build reserves and pay savers dividends wherever possible.

Each credit union has a 'common bond' which determines who can become a member. Usually people living or working locally will join an area's credit union.

Credit Unions financial products are transparent and put the customernot the profits-first. Money invested into a credit union stays locally, benefiting the wider community.
