DID YOU KNOW?

Learning Disability Wales (LDW) have been working tirelessly to prepare the launch of Gig Buddies in Cardiff. The project has been running in Sussex now for almost five years and the time has come to turn Gig Buddies into a social franchise. Gig Buddies matches adults who have a learning disability to a volunteer who has similar interests, to go to events together that they both love.

This means Gig Buddies will share their ways of working to build a networked community of like-minded people committed to enabling people with learning disabilities to lead full and active social lives.

They work with a number of organisations, charities, support providers, art organisations, and local authorities. What is important is that their hearts are in the right place, both as an organisation and the staff, and the people who work there.

Learning Disability Wales have got Gig Buddies off the ground thanks to the wonderful First Choice Housing Association who have provided funding to match 20 pairs of Gig Buddies, who will attend one event per month, plus regular social meet-ups, for the next year.

They're not stopping there though. The aim is to spread the scheme throughout the whole of Wales. There's already a brilliant project called Connect Buddies in Conwy, and LDW will be working to sustain Gig Buddies in Cardiff beyond the first year and encourage similar projects in other areas.
