Community shares schemes are a way of raising money to fund a project. They can be used to save local shops and pubs, finance renewable enegery developments, transform community facilities, or fund new sports clubs; the choices are endless.

The benefits of community shares are:

- Community shares are a perfect way for communities to invest in enterprises serving a community purpose
- Investors have the satisfaction of knowing they have helped change their communities for the better
- Investors have a democratic say in how their scheme is run Shareholders have one vote each, regardless of their shareholding
- Investors have the potential to make a return on their investment
- Investors could trade volunteer hours on the project for shares
- Helps build strong independent communities
- Helps fund projects which might struggle to find traditional forms of investment
