

Method

- Finely chop half the lettuce and quarter the tomatoes.
- Whisk eggs, coconut oil, salt & pepper, chives & parsley into a bowl.
- Heat the olive oil in the frying pan on a medium heat.
- Heat up the grill medium/high and place bacon under the grill for 3-4 minutes.
- Cut cooked bacon into small pieces.
- Add the egg mixture into the frying pan.
- Add cooked bacon pieces and parmesan cheese to taste to finish off the omelette.
- Heat the tortilla wraps in the microwave for 10 seconds or until warm, then lay out on plate.
- Carefully place the omelette on the wrap adding the chopped salad.
- Carefully roll the tortilla up and enjoy.

- Salt and Pepper
