Tim went to West Midlands Safari Park for his birthday. It was a full-on day.


At the Safari Park, Tim held his hand out of the window to feed the giraffes, which was very brave.

The leftover food was also donated to a homeless charity in Builth Wells to minimise waste and help those more in need – what a great idea!










From making your own coronation crowns, bunting and decorations, singing, dancing, eating and drinking, having fun, making friends and celebrating together. Did I mention lots of cakes??

BLOOM AND GROW



A gardens beauty never lies in one flower. We are introducing a gardening section, with the help of Glen, to give you the tools you need to bloom and grow in your outside spaces.

SOWING VEG SEEDS

If you haven't already, now is a good time to start sowing your seeds either on an indoor window sill, greenhouse, or in a cold frame. You don't need to spend anything on trays, and labels etc. what I do is save up empty grape or tomato punnets.

- 1. Give them a quick wash, then with a permanent marker, write what you want to grow and the date on both sides.
- 2. Use seed soil, or ordinary soil (as long as you crumble out any lumps). Fill containers about a 1/3 of the way up.
- 3. My favourite to grow:
 - Leeks = lightly sprinkle the seeds in
 - Beetroot = put about 10 in, which can be separated later
 - Courgettes = add 2 seeds
 - Runner beans = add 2 or 3 seeds (I prefer to start this way, as you are in total control of how much water is given so they don't rot or get killed in the ground by too much rainfall or late frost).
- 4. Lastly, only water lightly. The soil shouldn't be soaked and DO NOT be tempted to put them outside early due to good growth, or because the sun is shining! Wait until beginning of June, this way you should be guaranteed not to have lost any from late frost.

TROUBLE WITH ANTS

When the weather starts to warm up, the ants start invading your patio, veg plot, or infesting your prized pots. Here is my guide on how to deter an infestation:

Firstly, NEVER EVER USE hot water. Initially you will kill the one on top, but by the time that water goes under ground, you'll be doing them a huge favour by warming/incubating their eggs for them and doubling the problem. Remember Ants like, dry/hot locations. I had an infestation in large Bay leaf tree pot once. I added 8 buckets of water, and then put in a 9th bucket with mixed chilli and curry powder and moved the pot to a shady area for a week. The ants then relocated.

- 1. If possible, I would give the area a really good watering, e.g., 6-8 watering cans.
- 2. Then mix in a spoon of chilli and/or curry powder and pour in.

This method is beneficial, as its animal/people-friendly, unlike insect products contain chemicals that come with warnings as being harmful to touch, especially for our service users who like to go out in bare feet as we all do to relax or sensory.

If there are ant mounds, I would use a shovel to open it, let any birds have a feed first then repeat steps 1 & 2 and close the mound back up.

When asked how they like their new home, Audrey replied " I love it here, everyone is friendly and smiling at me."


"I was told I'm very important as I have the job of welcoming staff and visitors in the mornings," Clive added.

CARTREFI KITCHEN

ICE DAIQUIRI LOLLIES

These Ice Daiquiri Lollies are a must as the weather starts to get warmer! Can me made with or without alcohol, whichever you fancy.

Ingredients:

- 150g blackberries
- 400g watermelon flesh
- 1 tbsp ripe peaches
- 1 tbsp lime juice
- 150g golden caster sugar
- 100ml lime juice
- 200ml light rum (or for non-alcoholic versions, lemonade)

Equipment:

- Saucepan
- Blender
- Sieve
- Chopping board

• Knife

- 12 Ice lolly moulds
- 12 Ice lolly sticks



Method:

- 1. Stir the sugar with 275ml water over a low heat until dissolved. Bring to the boil and simmer for 2 minutes. Leave to cool then add the lime juice and rum. Chill.
- 2. Purée a third of the base mix in a blender with the blackberries.
- 3. Purée another third of base mix with the watermelon
- 4. Roughly chop the peaches discarding the stones and toss with the lime juice to stop them going brown. Purée with the remaining third of base mix
- 5. Pour each mix separately through a sieve.
- 6. Fill the lolly moulds so you have 4 of each flavour. Add sticks and freeze.
- 7.To release the lollies, dip the moulds very briefly in hot water, right up to the top. They should slide out easily, otherwise slip a small knife down one side to release them.
